I'm honestly so happy to be in the job I am in because they have taught me so much and I have learned so much about who they are, and about how someone you don't even know can become someone who looks up to you.

Without them, I wouldn't have the patience, love, respect, open mind, and most importantly, the happiness that I have now. People don't realize the HUGE impact this job has on your heart. I wouldn't change this for the world.
